
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What to Expect


What to Expect

Academic Highlights

ELA

We've had a great start to the school year!
Our first ELA standard, 6.R.RL.10, focuses
on reading and understanding a variety of
literature (stories, dramas, and poetry)
independently and at grade level.

Students have been exploring different genres, making inferences, identifying key details, and discussing the author's purpose. They've also worked in teams and shared thoughtful ideas during class.

We have begun our first Math standard of the year: 6.M.NS.B.03, which focuses on fluently performing operations with decimals using the standard algorithm. Students have already engaged in some exciting activities and hands-on practice to build their skills. We have started our Introduction to Science


